Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you all enjoyed a restful half term. It was a pity that we experienced such bad weather at the end of the week. Luckily, neither of our schools sustained any serious damage, although both have been plagued with Internet issues at the beginning of the week. At Preston, this was quickly resolved. However, at Saxlingham, the storm had damaged a fibre optic cable within the village, meaning that the school has been without the Internet for several days now.

This week has also brought an announcement from the government regarding the 'Living With COVID Plan'. From Thursday 24 February, the government will remove the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days, and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. I would urge parents/carers to continue to be vigilant for symptoms of COVID-19 and to exercise caution if their child feels unwell as we continue to have cases in both schools (11 cases at Preston and 1 at Saxlingham) and it's in everyone's interests for us to work together to minimise the spread of infection.

On Wednesday, teachers from both schools met together to look at examples of writing from across the school. It was fantastic to see such a wonderful range of creative writing from every class.

Thank you to all the parents/carers who took the time to complete the questionnaire regarding the school's vision. I look forward to reading the responses and to updating you later in the half term.




We are planning to hold a coffee morning every term; the venue will alternate between Saxlingham and Preston.


