It is that time of year again for the annual Samaritan's Purse Shoebox Appeal. Here is the information you need if you would like to support us. There are flyers at the back of the church and suggestions for possible contents are below. There are a few flat pack boxes in the church or any shoebox can be used – often shops are happy to give these away. If using an ordinary shoebox, please wrap it in Christmas paper, with the lid wrapped separately and the two sections held together with an elastic band.

Items should be suitable for either a boy or girl between the ages of 2-4 years old, 5-9 years old or 10-14 years old. A donation of £5 per box covers the cost of shipping and other project costs. It is possible to give the donation online, cheque or by cash, using one of the flyers.

Please bring the shoeboxes to the church by the deadline of Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November and leave them near the font at the back of the church, anytime between 10am – 4pm.
