Trips to Norwich Synagogue

On 1st and 8th December, lots of our pupils took part in half day trips to visit Norwich Synagogue. This was a new experience for the children and they loved being able to see their learning about Judaism brought to life.

Our workshop leader was Deborah, a member of the Jewish community, who ran two different workshops for us to take part in. In the first, we learnt more about Shabbat, the Sabbath or holy day for Jewish people, which starts at nightfall on Friday nights. Deborah demonstrated Shabbat traditions, let us sample challah bread, try on the kippah (a skull cap worn by Jewish boys and men) and learn Jewish songs.









In the second, we explored the beautiful prayer hall, spotting features and finding out what they meant. We saw the most holy part of a synagogue: the Ark, which houses the Torah scrolls. The children were able to dress up in the tallit (traditional prayer shawl) and even had a go at writing in Hebrew.
