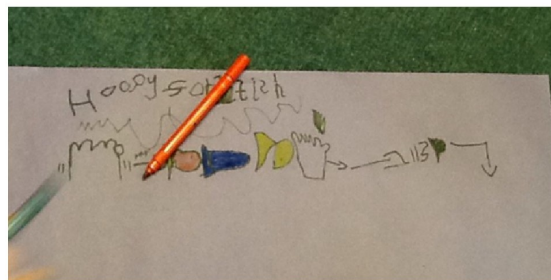
LADYBIRD CLASS NEWS



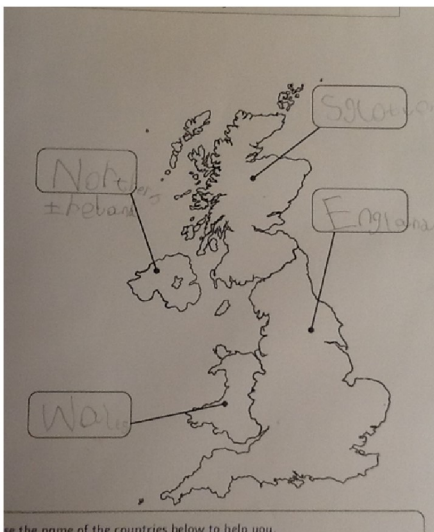
