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PARKING ON HENRY PRESTON ROAD AND RICHES CLOSE

Local residents, have once again, raised concerns about dangerous and inconsiderate parking of vehicles visiting the school premises, particularly at drop off and collection times.

If it is necessary for you to drive your child to/from school, then please note the following points:

- obstruction to driveways of neighbouring properties. The Highway Code states that you must not park opposite or within 10 metres of a junction. This is to allow drivers emerging from, or turning into, the junction a clear view of the road they are joining. It also allows them to see hazards such as pedestrians or cyclists at the junction. This morning, a number of vehicles were parked opposite the junction of Riches Close and on the corners of Riches Close, seemingly breaching The Highway Code.
- The Highway Code also states that if a parked car is blocking your side of the road, then you should give way to oncoming traffic.
- Although the speed limit is 30mph, it is clearly unsafe for vehicles to drive at this speed
 within a residential cul-de-sac, particularly at school drop off times, when there will inevitably increases in pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

If you are waiting a short while for the school gates to open, please show consideration for residents of neighbouring properties. <u>If waiting, please queue alongside the layby, and along the boundary between the pavement and the school, rather than in front of neighbouring properties</u>.

Thank you for your ongoing support with this matter. I am certain that we can work together with local residents and Norfolk Police to ensure the safety of our children as they travel to and from school.
