## Library Books



- Times Table Rock Stars currently only being set for children in year 2 onwards.
- Knowledge Organiser (key facts and vocabulary to learn as well as optional topic related activities) - this will be allocated via Seesaw and a paper copy will be sent home with your child.
- Reading Challenges (aim for one activity a week) please find these in your child's reading diary

Below are a few reminders of things your child needs to bring to school:

# Water Bottles

# Weather Appropriate Clothing and Sun Hats



Please make sure your child has weather appropriate clothing with them in school every day. As the weather is getting warmer, please make sure your child has a sun hat in school as we like to use the outside areas as much as possible during lesson times as well as during play times.

<u>Ventilation in the Classrooms</u>

We will be continuing to keep the classroom well ventilated so your child might want to wear extra layers underneath their uniform on chillier or breezier days.

Our topic this term is 'Power and Glory'. Our enquiry question is 'Does protection show power or fear?'

We will be exploring this topic through our Power of Reading books in literacy.

In **geography**, we will be exploring compass directions, maps, and using aerials photographs to identify key landmarks. We will be learning to identify geographical features of Norwich using the appropriate vocabulary.

In history, we will be learning about Norwich Castle as it is a significant place in our locality.

In **science**, we'll be learning about seasonal changes as well as uses of everyday materials. We will be continuing to develop our skills when working scientifically.

Please refer to your child's knowledge organiser for this term for more details about this topic. Their knowledge organiser will include key facts and vocabulary for the children to practise and learn at home.
