Curriculum

This term, our topic is 'Power and Glory (and Conflict)' which I'm sure the children will enjoy. However, before we start this, we will look at ways in which the earth has changed, such as earthquakes and tsunamis.

In maths, we will continue our unit on fractions, moving onto mass and capacity.

In science, we will be looking at forces and magnets, as well as rocks. In PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) our theme is 'Caring and Responsibility'.

A reminder of what to bring to school
