# Bumblebee News











This week, we have been exploring materials and their properties.

We investigated how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.















In maths, we have been learning about time.

We have been learning how to read, make and draw the time on an analogue clock.























This week, we have also been collecting data about mini-beasts!



We used flow diagrams to help us to identify the mini-beasts that we saw and then we recorded the data we collected as a tally chart.
