Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Parking in the area of Henry Preston Road

Once again, concerns have been raised by residents regarding inconsiderate parking at drop off and collection times. If you travel to/from school by car, then please note the following points:

- Please park safely and legally without causing obstruction to driveways of neighbouring properties. The Highway Code states that you must not park opposite or within 10 metres of a junction. This is to allow drivers emerging from, or turning into, the junction a clear view of the road they are joining. It also allows them to see hazards such as pedestrians or cyclists at the junction.
- As the school is located towards the end of Henry Preston Road, which is a cul-de-sac, it may not be possible to drive right up to the school gates and find a parking space.
- Please be aware that a number of children and parents/carers cycle to and from school. Please reduce your speed and allow plenty of room when passing cyclists. Ensure that your parking does not increase the risk that cyclists and pedestrians will not be visible to road users.

If you are waiting a short while for the school gates to open, please show consideration for residents of neighbouring properties. Please do not step onto their gardens or allow your children to do so. Please do not obstruct driveways if residents are trying to move their vehicles. If waiting for the gates to open, we suggest that you queue alongside the layby which does not border any residential properties.

Thank you for your ongoing support with this matter. I am certain that we can work together with local residents, the police and the Parish Council to ensure the safety of our children as they travel to and from school.
