
<u>Dragonfly</u> <u>Class News</u>



In Dragonfly Class, we have been looking at the book 'Shackleton's Journey' by William Grill. We spent time studying the front cover, observing the symbols and repetitive patterns used. We used these observations to create our own front cover designs.





We have also been researching the 26 crew members who went on the journey alongside Ernest Shackleton. Over the next week, we will be writing our own personal statements in the role of our crew member.





In project, we have been exploring Boudicca Way, a 36 mile walk from Norwich to Diss. We learnt that the walk passes through Tasburgh and we have all walked part of it when we have been to the church as a school! As part of our learning, we have looked at several different maps of Boudicca Way, making observations about how they look, how much detail they have, how easy they would be to follow and if any symbols were shown on the map. Linking into our enquiry question 'How have we been shaped by the past?' we have spoken about why the walk is called Boudicca Way and significant Roman areas the walk passes through.
