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




Living Life to the Full

Project: Belonging

In **English** we have been reading 'The Boy at the Back of the Class'. We have had some interesting discussions about how we welcome new people and how our body language and words can have a big impact on others. We are learning what refugees are to further understand our main character.

To help our **spelling** skills, we have been revising how to spell contractions, such as 'wasn't' and 'I'll'. We practised where to place our apostrophes, as even confident spellers are unsure sometimes.



In **maths** we have been building upon our place value knowledge and representing this in different ways. We have just started learning roman numerals!



On Tuesday we celebrated Hello Yellow day, to raise awareness of looking after our **mental health**.

Many of us wore yellow items of clothing, and we practiced some mindfulness strategies in the classroom.



We had a whole day learning about **Harvest** and how it is celebrated by Christians.

We thought about what we were thankful for and showed this by hanging ribbons of thanks on a tree at the local church.

We identified foods that were not grown in the UK and found out where they were produced on a world map.

In **Science**, Year 4 have set up an investigation to find out how different drinks affect our teeth. We used eggs as a substitute for teeth (as we didn't want to dunk a child in coffee for a week!) and have left eggs to soak in different liquids. We are looking forward to seeing our results next week!


